

GUIDELINES FOR CURRICULUM ACCREDITATION/RE-ACCREDITATION OF PRE-ENROLMENT NURSING PROGRAMMES

(A) CURRICULUM

The curriculum comprises theoretical and clinical/practicum hours with a minimum clinical practice placement of 28 weeks (1120 hours) inclusive of final consolidated practice placement. The clinical practice experiences shall have well formulated learning outcomes that demonstrate the expected progression towards meeting Singapore Nursing Board's Core Competencies & Generic Skills for Enrolled Nurse (EN) (2023) and Scope of Professional Nursing Practice for the EN (2023).

(B) ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

The minimum entry requirements (MER) are as tabled below. All applicants must pass the medical examination and be certified to have the abilities to perform patient care activities in a safe and effective manner (Refer to Annex on Fitness to Practise Advisory for nursing students).

	Individuals who have sat for GCE O/N-level but do not meet the above Academic Entry Requirements may still be considered. Application will be assessed holistically, and any of the following relevant prior training or work experience will be taken into consideration when assessing application:

Revised August 2024

- ITE Skills Certificate (ISC) in Health Care (Inpatient/Outpatient/Home Care) with a min GPA of 2.8 (for ISC awarded before 2019) <u>OR</u> attained at least one Distinction in the modules (for ISC awarded from 2019 onwards)
- WSQ Advanced Certificate in Healthcare Support (Nursing) attained before 2019 <u>OR</u> WSQ Higher Certificate in Healthcare Support (Nursing) effective from 2020
- Minimum 2 years full-time direct patient nursing care experience

MER for entry into the 2-year Higher Nitec in Nursing:

3 GCE 'O' Level Grades

- Grade 1-8 in English Language
- Grade 1-7 in Mathematics
- Grade 1-8 in Science

Selection will be based on passing an interview by ITE Admission Committee.

(C) TEACHING STRATEGIES

The teaching strategies will include

- a variety of teaching and learning methods, including lectures, tutorials, practical laboratory skills, lessons, classroom and small group discussions, role-play, simulation-based learning, and ICT-enabled learning.
- use of simulation to facilitate critical thinking, problem-solving and development of clinical skills competence.

(D) CORE CONTENTS

The curriculum shall focus on the Singapore healthcare context and the core contents as listed below:

 - Pathophysiology
 - Microbiology
 - Nutrition

- 2) Behavioural, Social and Health Sciences
 - Psychology
 - Sociology
 - Global health trends and national health policies

 - Caring science
 - Communication & information technology
 - Health education and prevention of illnesses
 - Maintaining a safe environment
 - Evidence-based practice
 - Reflection on Practice
 - Clinical reasoning, multiple ways of thinking and decision making
- 4) Foundations of Nursing Practice
 - Medical-Surgical Nursing
 - Care of the Older Adult
 - Palliative care
 - Mental Health & Psychiatric Nursing
 - Intermediate & Long-term care
 - Professional, Legal and Ethical Nursing Practice
 - Collaborative Practice and Teamwork
 - Patient Safety and Quality Improvement
 - Nursing Skills (SNB's Core Competencies and Generic skills for ENs 2023)

- 5) Cross Disciplinary Modules (2 years pathway take one & 3 years take three)
 - Trends and Issues of Elder Care
 - Writing 101
 - Wellness & Mindfulness

Note: Cross Disciplinary modules are specific to ITE's Higher Nitec programme and subject to revision.

- 6) Elective Modules (2 years pathway take one, 3 years take all eight)
 - Conversational Language
 - Foundations of Mother & Childcare
 - Understanding Cancer & Palliative Care
 - Community & Integrated Care
 - Fundamentals of Healthcare Ethics & Law
 - Principles of Mentoring & Coaching
 - Innovation & Entrepreneurship
 - Introduction to Evidence-Based Practice in Healthcare

Note: Electives modules subject to revision, based on trends and needs of healthcare industry.

(E) CLINICAL NURSING PRACTICE AND CLINICAL PRACTICE REPLACEMENT USING SBE

Replacement for the Pre-enrolment Nursing Programme: not more than **6 weeks** of clinical hours to be replaced with clinical simulation.

^{*}Consolidated Clinical Placement shall take place only when students have completed/passed all core modules. The placement period shall be at least 9 weeks.

NB: A maximum of 6 weeks of simulation learning can be used to replace clinical practice placement hours. Institutions planning to adopt this strategy shall write in to SNB for approval. Please refer to "Guidelines on the Use of Simulation-based Education to replace Clinical Hours for Preenrolment/Pre-registration Nursing Education" on SNB's "Guidelines and Standards" webpage.

(F) CANDIDATURE

In line with international educational standards and practice, students are required to complete preenrolment nursing programmes within 4 years and/or 6 years (for full-time programme of 2 /3 years duration respectively). This is to ensure that students' knowledge & competencies remain current and relevant prior to application for registration with Singapore Nursing Board. While education institutions retain full responsibility for the management of the pre-registration nursing programmes, setting time limits on candidature is to ensure public protection is not compromised.

(G) INFORMATION TO BE SPECIFIED FOR EACH SUBJECT/COURSE:

- 1) Curriculum vitae (CV) of lecturer teaching the subject. The CV shall include:
 - · Academic and teaching qualifications
 - Relevant work and teaching experience in subject area
 - Participation in continuing professional education in the last 2 years
- 2) Subject description
- 3) Learning outcomes
- 4) Content
- 5) Teaching methods: specify contact hours for each teaching strategy.
- 6) Assessment: specify methods and weightage for each type of assessment
- 7) Readings and references

Fitness to Practice Advisory for nursing students

As the delivery of direct patient care is a requisite of healthcare professions, all applicants must pass a medical examination and be certified to have the following abilities to perform patient care activities in a safe and effective manner:

- Mental-Cognitive ability (including interpersonal-communication ability and behavioural stability) to:
 - (a) provide safe care to populations, including safety to self
 - (b) demonstrate emotional-behavioural stability to function under the stress and pressure when performing nursing care on patients
 - (c) remain calm when being observed by instructors and other health care personnel during clinical practice attachments.

2) Physical ability to:

- (a) move around in the clinical environment, walk/stand, bend, reach, lift climb, push and pull, carry objects
- (b) perform patient transfers and complex sequences of hand-eye coordination.

3) Auditory ability to hear:

- (a) faint body sounds
- (b) auditory alarms
- (c) normal speaking level sounds (i.e., blood pressure sounds, monitors, call bells and person-to-person report).

4) Visual ability to:

- (a) detect changes in physical appearance, colour and contour
- (b) read accurately medication/ drug labels, markings on syringes and manometers, written and electronic communication.

The above required abilities are stipulated in consultation with Ministry of Education and the nursing schools to ensure nursing students are fit to practise when they apply for enrolment upon graduation from nursing programme.

Interested applicants with known condition(s) or unsure if their condition(s) may affect their ability to deliver safe and effective patient care are highly encouraged to contact Institute of Technical Education for more information.
